At our last meeting in Abuja, we agreed to focus on the following priority areas: Agriculture, Corruption, Education and Security. Therefore, it is my hope that drawing from the various presentations and contributions of all our governors and special guests here present, we would adopt, internalize and domesticate measures that would enhance the quality of governance not only in the States but in our country.

On behalf of my brother colleagues, I wish to express our profound gratitude to our brother and host, His Excellency, Babatunde Raji Fashola, the Governor of Lagos State for his hospitality. We also commend his developmental strides which are evident as one drives around the city of Lagos. Peer learning is our major hallmark as a Forum and there is no doubt that we have a lot to learn from Lagos State.

Finally, I wish to thank all our Governors and other distinguished guests for making out the time to ensure the success of this Retreat.
